Pink Patch Project Raises \$8,500

On December 4, 2018, the Grover Beach Police Department and the Grover Beach Police Officers' Association presented a check for \$8,500 to the Hearst Cancer Resource Center in San Luis Obispo from the proceeds raised during our 2nd Annual Pink Patch Project (#PinkPatchProject) fundraising campaign.

The Pink Patch Project is a collaborative cancer awareness fundraiser with a goal to raise awareness and funding for the research, treatment and care of those who are battling cancer. Equally important during this time is to educate the public about early detection and prevention of cancer. The proceeds from our fundraising were made possible from community donations, the sale of our pink shoulder patch and other novelty items, and from our 2nd Annual Pink Patch Project Golf Tournament.
