**SUBJECT:** COVID-19 Response Update

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### **RECOMMENDATION**

Receive an update on the countywide and City response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

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### **BACKGROUND**

The City continues its work in addressing the COVID-19 coronavirus pandemic following the direction of the County Public Health Department in coordination with other local agencies. The following is an update on the status of the COVID-19 pandemic in the county as well as the City's continued response since the last regular Council meeting on May 10.

#### **Countywide Status**

As of May 19, San Luis Obispo County has 21,234 confirmed COVID-19 cases with one current hospitalization and 75 individuals at home and 20,896 individuals recovered (approximately 98%). This is essentially the same number of cases as reported two weeks ago and in fact reflects a slight (less than 1%) decrease given a recalculation of cases in the county. These numbers continue the positive trends in case numbers and as a reference, there were approximately 3,500 active cases at the peak of the holiday surge in mid-January compared with 75 currently. Approximately 37% (7,931) of the confirmed cases in this county are in North County with 4,158 in Paso Robles and 3,773 in Atascadero, Templeton, and elsewhere. Approximately 33% (7,091) of cases are in the central part of the county with the vast majority (4,020) in San Luis Obispo.

In South County, there has been a total of 4,985 confirmed cases (approximately 23% of countywide cases) with 1,490 in Arroyo Grande, 1,569 in Nipomo, 885 in Grover Beach, 692 in Oceano, and 342 in Pismo Beach. Case numbers in Grover Beach per 1,000 residents (65) continue to be lower than Arroyo Grande (83) and Oceano (96) though higher than Pismo Beach (42). There has also been a slight decrease in cases in Grover Beach over the past two weeks similar to the countywide average and positive trends in case numbers.

As the Council is aware, the State uses an approach called the *Blueprint for a Safer Economy* to determine what businesses can and cannot open safely during the COVID-19 pandemic. Every county is assigned to a tier based on its test positivity and adjusted case rate and counties are moved to less or more restrictive tiers based on changing metrics including a "health equity" metric for census tracts with lower health conditions that must be met to move to a less restrictive tier. The table on the following page shows the four tiers of the *Blueprint* approach and the metrics used to determine placement based on the number of vaccinations administered in the state:

San Luis Obispo County is currently in the “orange” or “Moderate” tier based on the *Blueprint*. The county currently has an adjusted case rate of 3.3 new cases per day per 100,000 population on a rolling seven-day average and a positivity rate of 1.2% and health equity metric of 1.2%. Attachment 1 shows the comparison of restrictions under each tier for the Council’s reference. While the county may be able to enter the “yellow” or “Minimal” tier at some point soon if metrics continue to decline, the State plans to lift remaining restrictions for businesses and other activities including the face coverings mandate beginning on June 15. This plan is entitled *Beyond the Blueprint* and would effectively end the four-color tiers of restrictions and allow normal business operations and activities if vaccine supply was sufficient and hospitalizations remained low.

The City continues to monitor these trends carefully in conjunction with the County and other local agencies and carry out compliance work to protect public health and safety. The City remains committed to helping achieve community compliance with State and local orders focused on education and awareness with enforcement action as a last resort if other steps are not successful. Businesses in the city overall have continued to do an excellent job of complying with the public health requirements including adherence to the State’s order mandating face coverings usage indoors. The level for compliance activity has continued to decrease given the current level of allowed activity and overall compliance level of residents and businesses. Such compliance continues to be important in helping our community continue to meet the public health thresholds for greater reopening of businesses and activities.

The County continues to work diligently on vaccine distribution which has been key to ending this pandemic. The County has administered 158,663 vaccine doses as of May 14 at vaccination sites in San Luis Obispo, Paso Robles, and Arroyo Grande. Individuals now 12 years or older can sign up for a vaccine appointment on the County’s website at [COVID-19 Vaccines in SLO County - San Luis Obispo County \(recoverslo.org\)](https://www.slo.org/COVID-19/Vaccines-in-SLO-County-San-Luis-Obispo-County-recover slo.org). The City is sending out communications to encourage community members to get vaccinated in conjunction with County Public Health. The County has announced that the County Public Health vaccination sites will close on June 4 given widespread availability of vaccines at local pharmacies.

**Business Assistance Update**

The City continues to work with the South County Chambers of Commerce on the “#BuyLocal” gift card program launched on February 10 to support businesses in the continued economic recovery from COVID-19. The City committed to providing up to \$50,000 to purchase gift cards to participating Grover Beach businesses given to customers who spend at least \$100 at a retailer, restaurant, or other business within the city and submit receipts to the Chamber. There are 27

businesses currently participating in this program with the list of businesses available on the Chamber's website where people can submit receipts ([Grover Beach #BuyLocal Program \(jotform.com\)](#)). As of May 20, there have been 1,135 individual receipts submitted representing approximately \$85,000 in customer spending. Counting the \$26,000 spent to date purchasing gift cards at participating businesses, there has been approximately \$111,000 in additional spending at local businesses since the program began. The #BuyLocal program continues to provide significant economic benefit by incentivizing customer spending at local businesses by residents and visitors. The City and Chamber plan to continue this program through this summer using available funds.

### **City Response Update**

Lastly, the City continues to provide services to our community in accordance with statewide orders and public health guidelines though City facilities including City Hall and Community Centers remain closed to public access. City employees continue to work both remotely and in the office in accordance with public health guidance on offices while continuing to provide services for the public. The City is finalizing its reopening plan to reopen public access to City facilities by the end of May. Staff is also planning for a return to in-person Council and Commission meetings this summer following the lifting of State restrictions on June 15 with a continued ability for the public to call in with comments along with providing them in person at the meeting.

The City is also beginning to resume special events this year starting with the recent Paint and Play with Mom event on May 15 following COVID protocols. The summer concert series will resume at Ramona Park this summer with the scheduling of concerts announced shortly with applicable COVID protocols for special events.
